# In the International Federations



## INTERNATIONAL AMATEUR ATHLETIC FEDERATION

\* The IIIrd European Indoor Championships were held on 12th and 13th March in the Grenoble Sports Hall. 300 athletes from 24 countries took part in these Championships.

\* The new film section of the bulletin of the *International Amateur Athletic Federation* publishes, in its edition no. 7, a second by second sequence in twelve photographs, of the 100 metres hurdles run by Heide ROSENDHAL (Germany).

\* The first meeting of the Coaching Sub-Committee was held in London on 13th January, 1972. It was agreed that one of the first tasks for the IAAF to undertake was to establish the extent of coaching help already being received by members at the present time. The idea of initially setting up Area Coaching Co-Ordinators to help the IAAF in their enquiries found favour with the Sub-Committee. Members of the International and Regional Coaches' Associations are invited to meet the IAAF Council in Munich for the purpose of discussing coaching activity in the future.

\* The IAAF Bureau would like to compile a list of the colours (vest and shorts) to be worn by each country's athletes participating in the Olympic Games.

\* In athletics, probably more than in any other sport, there exists a great need for safety precautions and for their observance at all times.

This responsibility rests with everyone concerned in the development of the sport - officials, groundsmen, club coaches or teachers responsible for training and most of all with the athletes themselves.

Athletics is a sport where concentrated and maximum effort is being used by participants under the stress of competition and a variety of activities - running, jumping and throwing - may be taking place at the same time. Careful organisation is necessary when planning the use of facilities on the space available.

Great responsibility, therefore, rests on the coach or teacher for incorporating safety precautions in his coaching and for ensuring that these precautions are actually carried out by the young athlete during training. Safe methods must be taught from the beginning and care taken to ensure that the young athlete involved is mature and fit enough and has the necessary skill and stamina to undertake each new activity.

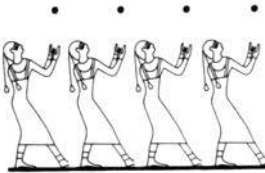
In the teaching of athletics, much depends on the coach/athlete relationship and on the self-discipline of all members of the class, club or group. Only when the teacher or coach has established such trust and degree of responsi-

bility in his pupils should activities with an element of danger be attempted. There must, above all, therefore, be good control, organisation and supervision in coaching.

\* The first qualifying tournament for the Games of the XXth Olympiad - Munich, 1972, was held at the end of last year in Asia. Japan has been selected.

The qualifying match for America was held on 7th February at Elkhart (Indiana). Four nations took part: Argentina, Canada, Mexico and the United States.

In March, sixteen national teams will meet in Spain to qualify for the remaining five places in the sixteen European nations allowed to take part in the tournament. At the end of March, there will be a competition in Tunisia between the teams from Algeria, Egypt, Morocco, Senegal and Tunisia to determine the team to represent the African continent.

\* The conference of the *Fédération Internationale de Handball* will be held on 23rd and 24th August, 1972 in Nuremberg (Germany).

#### FEDERATION INTERNATIONALE DE HOCKEY

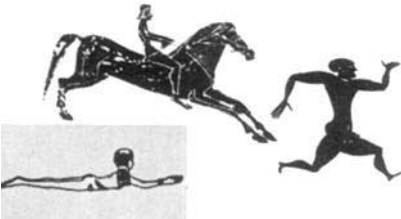
\* The eight nations tournament will be held from 11th to 14th May, 1972 at Santander (Spain). The Spanish representatives will receive teams from Belgium, Austria, United States, Great Britain, Italy and Switzerland.

The 7th referees' conference will also take place during this event.

\* It has been decided by the *Fédération Internationale de Hockey* that all players in international competitions must wear a number.

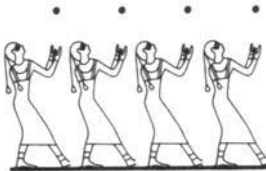
