JEFF BOEHM, VENTURA TEMPLE CHRISTIAN, VOTED TOP PERFORMER IN SMALL SCHOOLS BASKETBALL...

FOR RELEASE: MONDAY AFTERNOON, MARCH 25th & TUES. AMs ...***PLEASE HONOR RELEASE DATE!

JEFF BOEHM, WHO LED TEMPLE CHRIS. OF VENTURA TO THE SMALL SCHOOLS DIVISION CIF CHAMPIONSHIP 81-63 OVER HESPERIA CHRISTIAN, HAS BEEN VOTED PLAYER OF THE YEAR FOR THE 1985 SEASON BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF ATHLETICS. BOEHM, A 6-4 SENIOR FORWARD, WAS SELECTED THE GAME'S MOST OUTSTANDING PLAYER IN THE FINALE AGAINST HESPERIA CHRISTIAN, AS HE SCORED 24 POINTS AND ADDED NINE ASSISTS.

The Temple Christian Knights from Ventura finished the '85 season with a 19-game winning streak, as the team finished 22-2. Hesperia Christian, Christian League champions, wound up the year 21-3.

Boehm, a four-year starter for coach Dennis Judd, has been the Heritage League's MVP the past two years. In 85 career games he scored 2,037 points for a 24-point average. This season Boehm averaged 26.6 points and 8.6 rebounds. He had a 54% field goal mark and 75% from the foul line.

The Southern Section's top regular-season scorer, Robbie Miller of Voyagers Christian is a member of the '85 Small Schools Team. Jake Devane of Cal Prep and MVP Boehm are also among the top ten season scorers.

Small Schools all-star team players will be honored at the Foundation's 48th annual High School Basketball Awards Program to be held at the First Interstate Bank in downtown Los Angeles on Saturday, April 27 at 10:30 am. SERRANO HIGH'S RICH LEONARD VOTED PLAYER OF YEAR IN 1-A DIVISION SOUTHLAND BASKETBALL...

RICHARD LEONARD, COACH MEL BANTAU'S HIGH-SCORING SENIOR GUARD FOR THIS YEAR'S DE ANZA LEAGUE CHAMPION SERRANO DIAMONDBACKS, HAS BEEN VOTED CIF SOUTHERN SECTION DIVISION 1-A PLAYER OF THE YEAR BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF ATHLETICS. THE ANNUAL ALL-STAR TEAM SELECTIONS BY THE BOARD OF SPORTS JOURNALISTS, WAS MADE RECENTLY IN CULVER CITY.

In a new selection format, one team of 12 players was named for 1985 honors in the 1-A Division....as was done in the Small Schools Division. The division's top seeded teams, Chadwick and Serrano, led other 1-A teams placing two players apiece on the 12-player honor team.

Most valuable player in the DeAnza League, Rich Leonard wound up the second highest scorer in Santa Barbara County with a 25.2 point season average. The Diamondbacks entered the playoffs 21-1, with Leonard and teammate guard Ryan Holman leading the way. Serrano got over first-round opponent Ontario Christian, 74-71, but lost in the second round to eventual finalist Crossroads, 85-80.

Chadwick's Dolphins won the Prep League title and the 1-A Division championship, defeating Crossroads 63-56. The Dolphins completed their full season, 26-2, while runner-up Crossroads, a wild card entry, finished 19-9.

SANTA CLARA HIGH SCHOOL'S SAINTS WON THE 2-A DIVISION BASKETBALL TITLE, 57-36, OVER EL MONTE; COACH LOU CVIJANOVICH WON HIS NINTH CIF SOUTHERN SECTION CROWN; AND STACEY CVIJANOVICH, THE COACHES SON, WAS UNANIMOUSLY SELECTED AS THE DIVISION'S PLAYER OF THE YEAR, AS MEMBERS OF FIRST INTERSTATE BANK ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S HIGH SCHOOL BOARD OF ATHLETICS MADE THEIR ANNUAL ALL-STAR TEAM SELECTIONS. SCHURR HIGH SCHOOL SENIOR CENTER KEVIN KURZ HAS BEEN VOTED 3-A DIVISION BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S BOARD OF HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETICS. THE ANNUAL SELECTIONS TOOK PLACE IN CULVER CITY, WITH SOME 25 SPORTS JOURNALISTS, REPRESENTING NEWSPAPERS THROUGHOUT THE SOUTHLAND, TAKING PART IN THE DAY-LONG SELECTION MEETING.

Kurz, a 6-4, senior center for the 19-7 Schurr Spartans, finished as the number four regular season scorer in the CIF Southern Section...with a 28.8 point average. Kurz scored 21 points and grabbed 273 rebounds, averaging 27.7 and 10.5 respectively. The Foothill League MVP, Kevin was a 54% shooter from the field and 86% from the line. Setting school records for career points, season points and scoring average, Kurz had a 53-point high game against Brea this season. The Foothill League's number two team lost to top-seeded Pomona (60-50 in overtime) in the second round of the playoffs.

Morningside High's Monarchs won the 3-A Division title. The Pioneer League Champions defeated Canyon (85-57), La Quinta (59-46), Ganessa (63-57) and Damien (64-63) before shipping the Bonita Bearcats in the title game 68-52. Morningside finished the year 23-4, while Bonita concluded 25-6.

RICH GRANDE, 6-2 SENIOR GUARD ON COACH STEVE KEITH'S 4-A DIVISION CHAMPIONSHIP GLENDALE DYNAMITERS BASKETEERS, HAS BEEN NAMED PLAYER OF THE YEAR IN HIS DIVISION BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S PREP SELECTION BOARD. GLENDALE COMPLETED A PERFECT 28-0 SEASON, WITH WHAT COACH KEITH CALLS, "THE BEST GUARD IN THE SCHOOL'S HISTORY," LEADING THE WAY. Dominguez, a highly regarded team all season long, over-powered Redondo in the first round of 4-A playoff action, 84-35. The Dons then disposed of Dana Hills (64-48), Newport Harbor (49-43) and Buena (68-46) to reach the title match.

TO THE SURPRISE OF ABSOLUTELY NO ONE, MATER DEI'S TOM LEWIS WAS A UNANIMOUS PLAYER OF THE YEAR SELECTION IN CIF DIVISION 5-A BASKETBALL, AS MEMBERS OF FIRST INTERSTATE BANK'S ATHLETIC FOUNDATION SELECTION BOARD MADE THEIR ANNUAL ALL-STAR BASKETBALL TEAM SELECTIONS RECENTLY IN CULVER CITY. IT WAS THE 48TH ANNUAL MEETING OF THE BOARD OF SPORTS JOURNALISTS, REPRESENTING 25 SOUTHLAND NEWSPAPERS.

Due to a realignment of leagues and divisions within the CIF Southern Section, a new format was employed by the Foundation's selection board, with one, twelve-player team being named for honors. Lewis, a first-team selection in both 1983 and '84, led the Monarchs to the Division title with a sparkling 31.8 point average, second best in Southern Section play this year.

The finalists in the 5-A Division playoffs, Mater Dei and Ocean View, placed five players on the 1985, first-ever 5-A Team....three players from Mater Dei and a pair from Ocean View. Lewis, who averaged 30.7 points last year as a junior, led coach Gary McKnight's charges to three straight Angelus League titles and the 5-A crown, 69-58. The team finished 29-0, the first Orange County team to finish a season undefeated. The Monarchs whipped Verbum Dei (66-42), Compton (75-39), and Serra (75-56) before knocking over the Seahawks to end a perfect season.
